The PS2701A-1 is an optically coupled isolator containing a GaAs light emitting diode and an NPN silicon phototransistor to realize an excellent cost performance.


This package is SOP (Small Outline Package) type and has shield effect to cut off ambient light. It is designed for high density mounting applications.






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PACKAGE DIMENSIONS (in millimeters)








DIODE POWER DISSIPATION vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE



FORWARD CURRENT vs. FORWARD VOLTAGE




COLLECTOR TO EMITTER DARK CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




TRANSISTOR POWER DISSIPATION vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




COLLECTOR CURRENT vs. COLLECTOR TO EMITTER VOLTAGE




COLLECTOR CURRENT vs. COLLECTOR SATURATION VOLTAGE








SWITCHING TIME vs. LOAD RESISTANCE




FREQUENCY RESPONSE




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
CURRENT TRANSFER RATIO vs. FORWARD CURRENT




SWITCHING TIME vs. LOAD RESISTANCE

NOTES ON HANDLING

1. Recommended soldering conditions

(1) Infrared reflow soldering



Avoid removing the residual flux with freon-based and chlorine-based cleaning solvent.

2. Cautions regarding noise

Be aware that when voltage is applied suddenly between the photocoupler's input and output or between collector-emitters at startup, the output transistor may enter the on state, even if the voltage is within the absolute maximum ratings.

USAGE CAUTIONS

- 1. Protect against static electricity when handling.
- 2. Avoid storage at a high temperature and high humidity.
