
## description

The SN65LVDM1676 and SN65LVDM1677 (integrated termination) are sixteen differential line drivers and receivers configured as transceivers that use low-voltage differential signaling (LVDS) to achieve signaling rates in excess of 600 Mbps. The transmission media may be printed-circuit board traces, backplanes, or cables. The large number of transceivers integrated into the same substrate along with the low pulse skew of balanced signaling, allows extremely precise timing alignment of clock and data for synchronous parallel data transfers. (Note: The ultimate rate and distance of data transfer is dependent upon the attenuation characteristics of the media, the noise coupling to the environment, and other system characteristics.)






## logic diagram (positive logic)








Figure 1. Driver Voltage and Current Definitions





Figure 2. Driver  $V_{\mbox{\scriptsize OD}}$  Test Circuit





Figure 3. Test Circuit and Definitions for the Driver Common-Mode Output Voltage










Figure 6. Voltage Definitions






Figure 8. Enable/Disable Time Test Circuit and Waveforms




Figure 14. Driver Test Equipment Setup




Figure 15. Typical Driver Eye Pattern for the SN65LVDM1676




Figure 16. Receiver Test Equipment Setup




Figure 17. Typical Receiver Eye Pattern for the SN65LVDM1677



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## APPLICATION INFORMATION

#### fail safe

One of the most common problems with differential signaling applications is how the system responds when no differential voltage is present on the signal pair. The LVDS receiver is like most differential line receivers, in that its output logic state can be indeterminate when the differential input voltage is between –50 mV and 50 mV and within its recommended input common-mode voltage range. Tl's LVDS receiver is different, however, in how it handles the open-input circuit situation.




Figure 18. Open-Circuit Fail Safe of the LVDS Receiver

Open-circuit means that there is little or no input current to the receiver from the data line itself. This could be when the driver is in a high-impedance state or the cable is disconnected. When this occurs, the LVDS receiver will pull each line of the signal pair to near  $V_{CC}$  through 300-k $\Omega$  resistors as shown in Figure 18. The fail-safe feature uses an AND gate with input voltage thresholds at about 2.3 V to detect this condition and force the output to a high-level, regardless of the differential input voltage.

It is only under these conditions that the output of the receiver will be valid with less than a 50-mV differential input voltage magnitude. The presence of the termination resistor, Rt, does not affect the fail-safe function as long as it is connected as shown in the figure. Other termination circuits may allow a dc current to ground that could defeat the pullup currents from the receiver and the fail-safe feature.





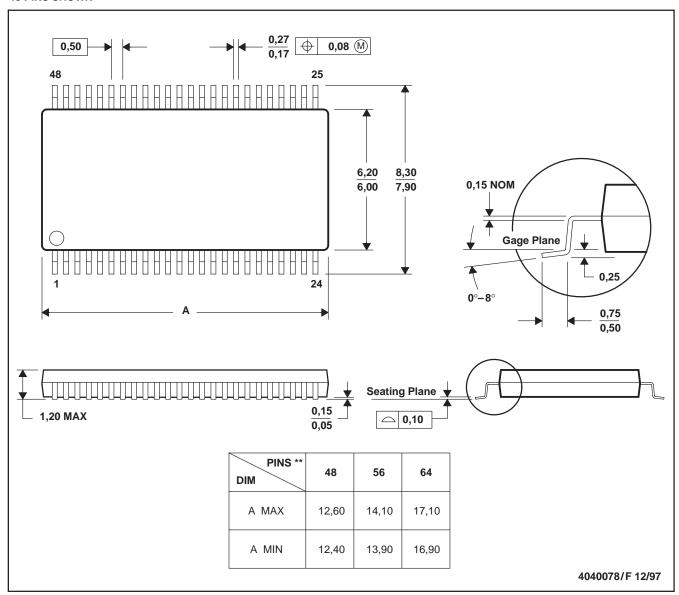
