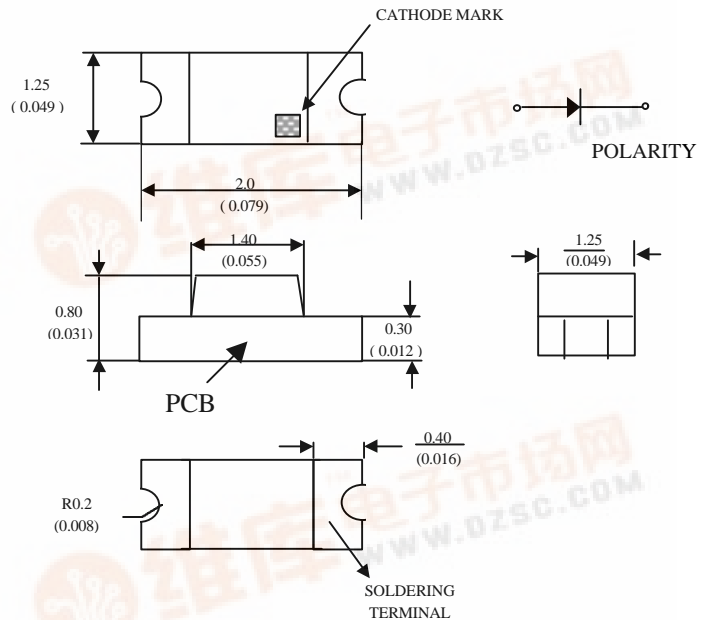

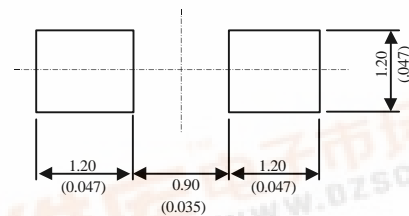

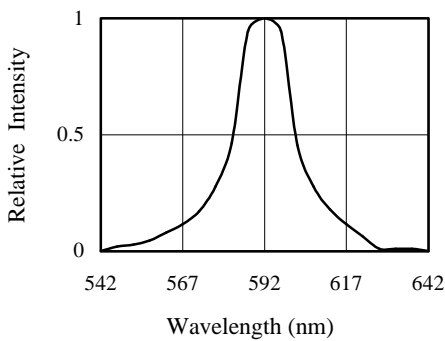


FIG.1 RELATIVE INTENSITY LUMINOUS VS. WAVELENGTH

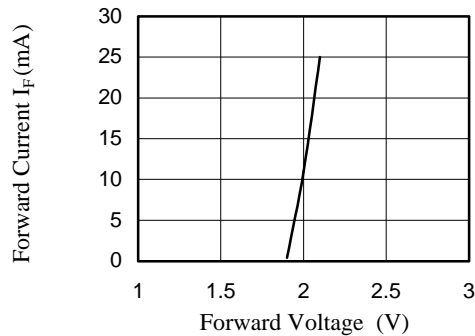


FIG.2 FORWARD CURRENT VS. FORWARD VOLTAGE.

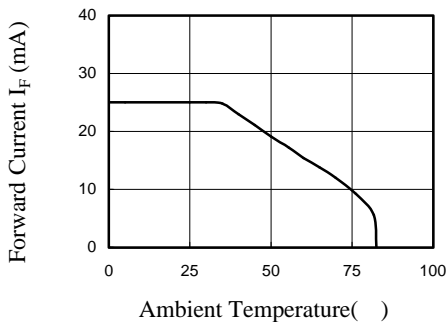


FIG. 3 FORWARD CURRENT VS. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE.

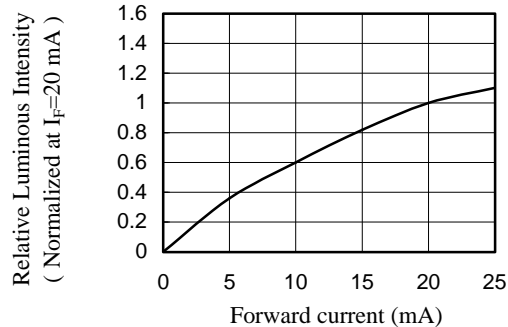


FIG. 4 RELATIVE LUMINOUS INTENSITY VS. FORWARD CURRENT.

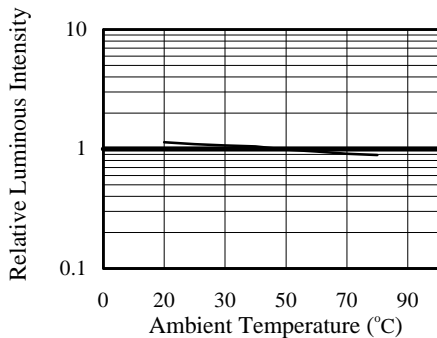


FIG.5 LUMINOUS INTENSITY VS. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE

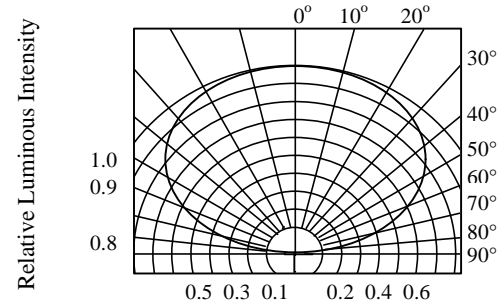


FIG.6 RADIATION DIAGRAM
